Piety-Study-Action

This year contained a painful approach to Christmas Eve. Every year since Tina and I got together, her immediate family of siblings, nephews and children - would come to our home, after attending a Moravian Love-Feast midafternoon Service, for an evening of gift exchanging, and lots of laughter, finger-foods, beverages, and traditions of her family - I would grow to learn about.

But this year was different. Over the last 5 months, we had unexpectedly lost two young family members who would always be at our home on Christmas Eve, a nephew and an adopted step-son, victims of substance use disorder. And part of their legacy to the family was that we all knew we had multiple family members with SUD histories, who were always silently challenged.

With a strong intuitive hunch, I felt I had an opportunity to do something, that might make a difference. I sat down and wrote every family member expected to be at our home that evening — a personal hand-written Christmas letter, with a folded, very modest personal Christmas gift check, sealed in an envelope, with their name on the outside.

In my letter to each of them, I told them I was seizing this opportunity to tell them how much I enjoyed their unique personal gifts to the family (they are all very talented), their love of life, and their truly unique personality. I told them that I quietly recognized how hard they were working — "to make better decisions," to build a better life for themselves, and that I wanted them to have a wonderful Christmas, and a better 2025!

I was serving at St. Clement's Late Evening Christmas Eve Service, and didn't know their reactions to my letter(s) - which were opened while I was gone to the Service.

When I got back home that evening, Tina told me they were all very surprised — and smiling — after opening my letter(s). (The very modest checks seemed secondary.)

Each of them thanked me for making the time to write them, personally, and a couple of them asked, "Are you going to write us next year...?"

And from the legacy of two recently lost family members, way too early in life, with no instructions given, on Christmas Eve at our family gathering – for the first time in memory, there was no alcohol, no yelling, no bruised, hurt feelings occurring. Conversations were respectful, caring, and thoughtful – for this once-a-year special day, celebrating Christ's birth.

On reflection, Tina had sometimes asked me to, "write her a personal note," on special occasions, which I've gotten better at doing. This Christmas, I experienced another reason to write – and tell someone how important - and special - they are.

WOW.... Merry Christmas....to me!

At Cursillo we find a deepening relationship with Christ and hopefully become aware that Christ is always with us wherever we are. Sitting here in the hospital with monitors, blood draws, vitals checks and conferences around the clock, you might wonder are you alone?

The answer for me is no. Christ is with me even though there is discomfort and other issues. It is a comfort that is difficult to describe. For now, in the dark hours it is knowing you're not alone. It is like your best friend sitting with you on the porch and being quiet. It is a loving presence. And if you are open to His presence, it gives you the ability to endure.

And naturally, his messengers show up with skills. Advice. Treatments. All that is helpful. He has many workers. Insights come to us about who we are and whose we are. And one can look forward to better days, serving Him and our fellow man.

So, when we offer a little amount of time at a weekend, think of the gift we are giving of this awareness of Christ's presence and where it may be in the world. And who it may comfort. Or strengthen. Or transform.
